WashU Recognizes City-County Line, Rebrands as “Washington University Near St. Louis”

After a myriad of student complaints and protests, Washington University in St. Louis will officially be changing its name to “Washington University Near St. Louis” at the beginning of the Fall 2018 semester. This comes as a big win to students, especially those native to the city of Chicago who played an integral role in making the change happen.

Rumors that the St. Louis city limit only barely crosses Brookings Drive began to surface in early February, and since then the rumors have been confirmed and spread throughout the student body. As facts and falsehoods spread like wildfire, a group of students, mostly from the city of Chicago, and not from the Chicago suburbs, rose out of the flames with a clear goal and the motivation to achieve it.

1. Place your copy of *Student Libel* in front of you with the long side up.




2. Fold the paper vertically.




3. Next, fold *Student Libel* in half horizontally.




4. Unfold.




5. Turn *Student Libel* ninety degrees such that the folded edge is on top.




6. Fold the top corners into the center line, making sure to keep them even.
